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## Private Provider Representative Needed For Gloucester Community Policy & Management Team

The Gloucester Board of Supervisors seeks a representative of a private organization or association of providers for children's or family services to serve a two-year term on the Gloucester Community Policy and Management Team (CPMT). The CPMT meets on the first Tuesday of each month at 12:30 p.m. to review cases and oversee funding requests related to the Children's Services Act (CSA).

The CSA is a Virginia law designed to create a collaborative system of services and funding for at-risk youth and families. Information may be found at *gloucesterva.info/161/Childrens-Services-Act*. The private provider representative would serve with agency representatives from local government, community services board, social services, juvenile court services, health department, and local school division, along with other representatives appointed by the Gloucester Board of Supervisors. Those serving on the team who do not represent a public agency are required to file a statement of economic interests as set out in § 2.2-3117½ of the State and Local Government Conflict of Interests Act (§ 2.2-3100 et seq.).
