Japanese Honeysuckle (*Lonicera japonica*) **Non-Native Invasive**
Coral Honeysuckle (*Lonicera sempervirens*)
Trumpet Creeper/Vine (*Campsis radicans*)
Clayton Honeysuckle (*Lonicera sempervirens*, 'John Clayton')
Sweetbay Magnolia (*Magnolia virginiana*)
Bradford Pear (*Pyrus calleryana* 'Bradford') **Non-Native Invasive**
Serviceberry/Shad Bush (*Amelanchier arborea*)
Brown-eyed Susan (*Rudbeckia triloba*)
Summer Phlox (*Phlox paniculata*)
Virginia Bluebells (*Mertensia virginica*)
Liverwort (*Hepatica americana*)
Golden Ragwort (*Packera aurea*)
Eastern Redbud (*Cercis canadensis*)
Bloodroot (*Sanguinaria canadensis*)
Jamestown (Atamasco) Lily (*Zephyranthes atamasca*)
Golden Ragwort (*Packera aurea*)
Jacob's Ladder (*Polemonium reptans*) (not common in the coastal plain)
Wild Columbine (*Aquilegia canadensis*)
Wild Bleeding Heart (*Dicentra eximia*)
Wild Petunia (*Ruellia caroliniensis*)
Brown-eyed Susan (*Rudbeckia triloba*)
Scarlet Hibiscus (*Hibiscus coccineus*)
Ebony Spleenwort Fern (*Asplenium platyneuron*)
Cinnamon Fern (*Osmunda cinnamomea*)
Purple (Pink) Muhly Grass (*Muhlenbergia capillaris*) (sometimes called "hairgrass")
Swamp Sunflower (*Helianthus angustifolius*)
Late/Large-Flowered Aster (*Symphotrichum grandiflorum*)
Stinking Camphorweed (*Pluchea foetida*) (Deer Deterrent)
