# Gloucester County Announces New Appointments in its Fiscal Services and Purchasing Departments



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Gloucester County Administrator Brent Fedors recently announced the appointments of Gloucester native Christine Joyce as Purchasing Manager in the Purchasing Department and Gloucester resident Maria Calloway as Fiscal Services Manager in the Fiscal Services Department. Both women have a rich history with the County government and employ first-hand experience in accomplishing the duties of the new roles they are assuming.

Joyce began her employment with the County's Facilities Management team in 2013 and transitioned to the Purchasing department in 2016, assuming the role of Buyer. In January of this year, she was promoted to Senior Buyer following the retirement of former Purchasing Director Bill Lindsey.

Joyce graduated from Rappahannock Community College with a degree in Business Administration. Since that time, she has earned her Virginia Contracting Certification and Professional Buyer Certification. She is a member of the Virginia Association of Governmental Purchasing and the National Institute of Governmental Purchasing.

She resides in Gloucester with her husband Hunter and their son.
